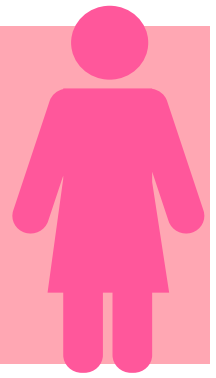


BREAST CANCER SCREENING SAVES LIVES

Female breast cancer was the **#1** diagnosis of new cancer cases among women in Pennsylvania in 2024, with 13,650 new cases projected for 2025.²

WHAT ARE THE SCREENING OPTIONS?

2024 Recommendations from the United States Preventive Services Task Force (USPSTF) ³

POPULATION	RECOMMENDATION	COVERAGE ⁴
Women 40 to 74 years	Biennial (every other year) screening mammography	For health insurance plans that began on or after September 23, 2010, the Affordable Care Act (ACA) requires that insurance plans must cover recommended screening tests, including screening mammograms for women aged 40 and older, at no cost when provided by in-network providers. Medicare Part B: - Covers one baseline mammogram for women aged 35–39. - Covers annual screening mammograms for women aged 40 and older. - Covers diagnostic mammograms as often as medically necessary, but the patient pays 20% coinsurance after the Part B deductible. - For full coverage of screening mammograms, the provider must accept assignment.

Results may require follow-up diagnostic testing that may incur additional costs.
